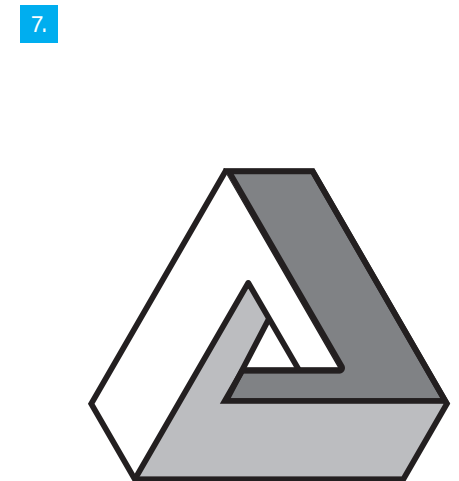
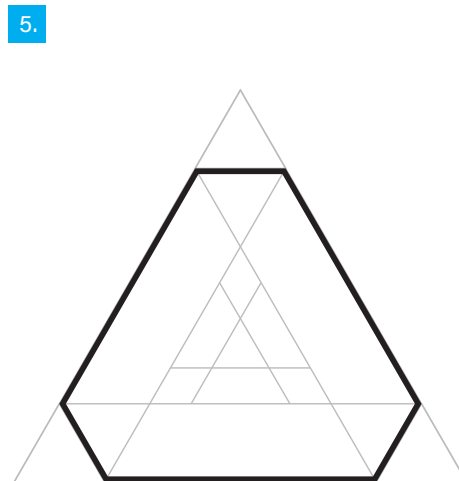
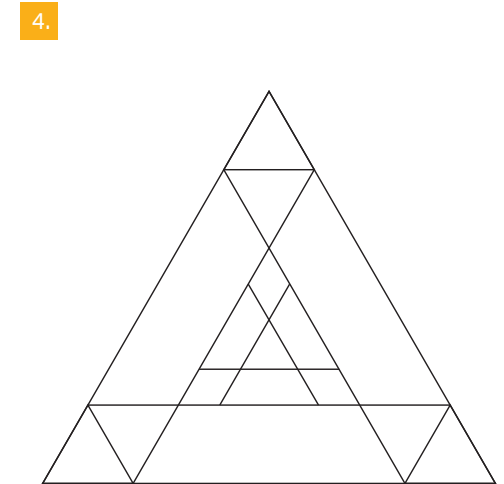
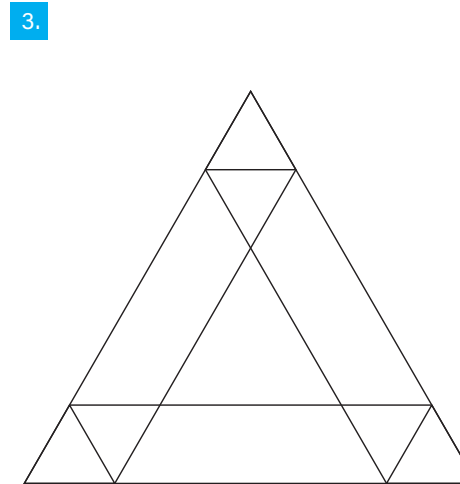
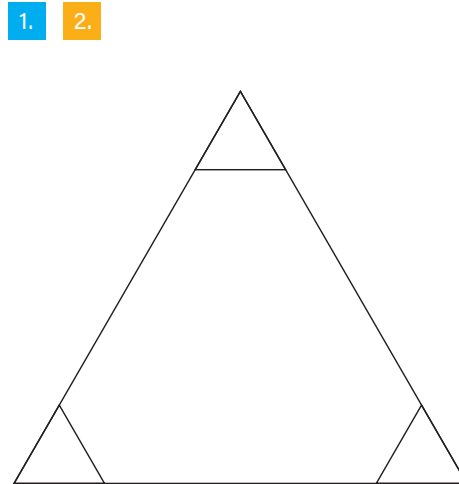


1. Draw an equilateral triangle.
2. Draw a line in each corner to make three equally sized smaller triangles.
3. Connect the vertices of the smaller triangles as seen in the diagram.
4. Draw three lines which are parallel with the lines in the inner triangle, as shown in the diagram so that there is a smaller triangle in the center.
5. Now all you need to do is to emphasise the most important lines with a marker. First, the outer lines, except for the vertices.
6. Emphasise the inner diagonal lines as seen in the diagram.
7. Colour in the three basic shapes that remain to finish your impossible triangle.

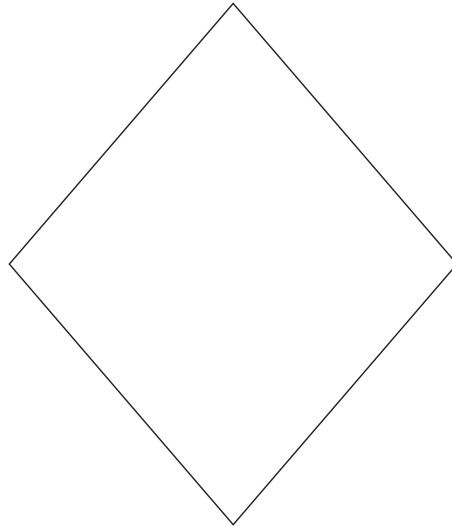


If you would like to draw an impossible rhombus, go to the next page.

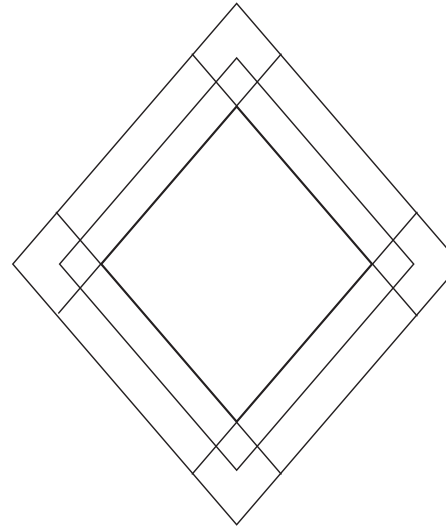
IMPOSSIBLE OBJECTS

1. Draw a rhombus.
2. Draw a larger and a smaller rhombus at an equal distance from the first one.
3. Lengthen the sides of the smallest rhombus to reach the outer rhombus.
4. Now emphasise the lines. First the ones of the inner rhombus.
5. Next, the ones of the middle rhombus. Be careful not to let the corners touch each other. Instead lengthen them as seen in the diagram.
6. Cut off the corners of the rhombus as seen in the diagram.
7. Emphasise the outer lines of the rhombus.
8. Erase the lines that are not emphasised and colour in your rhombus with two or four colours.

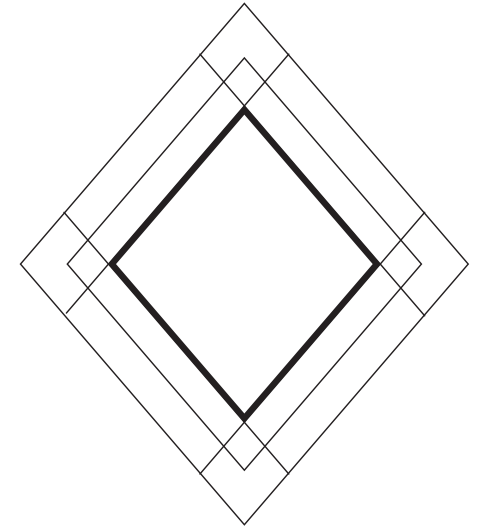

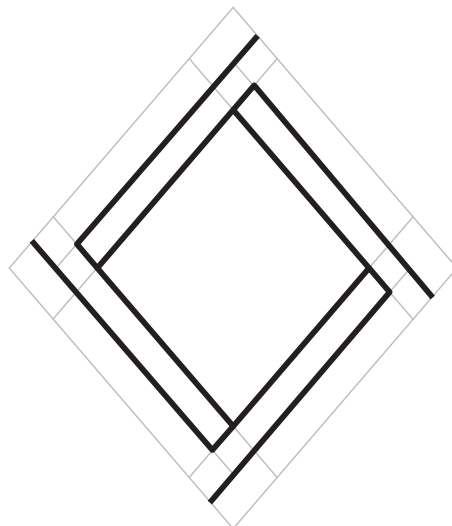

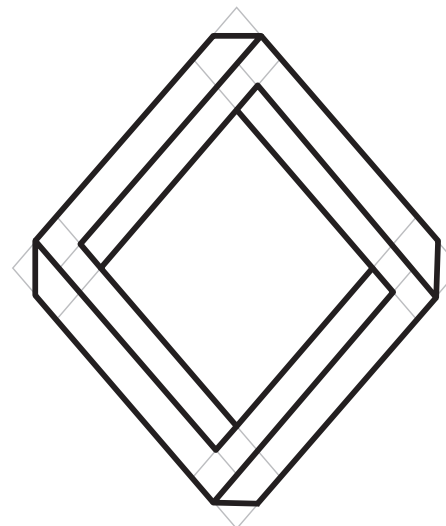
